
Story Tables & Small World Play

Marilyn Hayward has been one of the key Associates with Lisa Burman since 2012. She is well known for facilitating the *Introduction to Bookmaking Mini Course* and for her leadership at The Nest, Alberton PS. She is co-president of EChO and brings not only a wealth of knowledge and experience, but a great passion and a sense of fun to her workshops.

Sue Emmett is widely known in South Australia for her leadership in the Early Childhood community. Her most recent educational passions include the transition between Kindy and School - for children and families. She advocates for continuity of learning from birth to eight and believes strongly in the child's capacity to learn and have agency in their lives.

Susan Sandow has worked in early childhood settings for 15 years. She began working with babies and has since worked with age groups up to thirteen years in a variety of contexts including childcare settings, public and private schools, and OSHC services. In 2015, she was recognised by EChO SA for her outstanding commitment to early childhood education, particularly her understanding of the influence of the environment and pedagogy that connects children's learning and wellbeing. In 2016 Susan visited Reggio Emilia in Italy which further ignited her passion for creating environments as organisms for children. She is an advocate for childhood and play filled pedagogy.

Kim Coyle has held teaching and leadership positions in Birth-7 Schools in both the UK and Australia and has recently been accredited as a lead teacher through ATSI. She advocates for the rights of the child across Preschool and School settings, believing the child's voice should be visible and responded to in all educational setting.

Tracy Baines completed her Masters in Early Childhood in 2010 and has since been driving innovation and change at Blair Athol North B-7 school. In 2015 Tracy co-led an action research project, challenging the transition from preschool to school and how the structures of school have a profound effect on pedagogy and practice. Tracy is a strong advocate for the quality Early Years Pedagogy, creating learning environments that are respectful to children and provide challenge and intellectual stretch.
